Vancouver Art Gallery Presents One Night Only Performance by Renowned Contemporary Calligrapher Wang Dongling



September 27, 2016, Vancouver, BC - Renowned contemporary calligrapher Wang Dongling will arrive in Vancouver next week for a special performance at the Vancouver Art Gallery at 7:00pm, on Tuesday, October 4, 2016. Wang will write the Heart Sutra, one of the most important Mahayana Buddhist scriptures, using his calligraphic invention "chaos script (luanshu)" during this live performance.

Born in 1945, Wang Dongling is one of the foremost contemporary practitioners of calligraphy with a career spanning six decades. He is associated with the 90s experimental ink movement, which elevated the form of gestural markings over content. His radical invention "chaos script (luanshu)" is a new calligraphic script style that overturns the very foundations of this art form, in which characters and even entire columns of text interweave with each other. Wang's chaos script heightens the tension between a calligrapher's controls—honed by a lifetime of training—and the spontaneity of live performance. He has recently performed this work at The Metropolitan Museum of Art and Brooklyn Museum in New York, as well as the British Museum and Victoria and Albert Museum in London.
